

THE APRIL MEETING IN SANTA CRUZ

The six hundred sixty-sixth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the University of California, Santa Cruz, in Santa Cruz, California, on Saturday, April 26, 1969. There were 162 registrants including 139 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, there were two invited hour addresses at this meeting. Professor David Harrison of the University of Oregon presented a talk entitled *On quadratic forms over general fields*. He was introduced by Professor J. W. T. Youngs. Professor Theodor Ganea of the University of Washington lectured on *Numerical homotopy invariants and duality*. He was introduced by Professor Hans Samelson.

There were seven sessions of contributed ten minute papers with Professors W. F. Donoghue, W. J. Firey, N. R. Gray, T. J. Head, Melvin Henriksen, W. F. Pfeffer, and D. H. Potts presiding.
