

THE FEBRUARY MEETING IN NEW YORK

The five hundred sixty-sixth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, February 27, 1960, at the Washington Square Campus of New York University. About 135 persons attended, including 110 members of the Society.

Professor Serge Lang of Columbia University addressed the Society on *Some conjectures in diophantine equations* by invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings. Professor G. N. Garrison introduced the speaker.

There were four sessions devoted to contributed papers. The presiding officers were Professors H. J. Cohen, Wilhelm Magnus, Dr. W. L. Miranker, and Professor Cathleen Morawetz.
