THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN BATON ROUGE

The six hundred and sixty-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at Louisiana State University at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, November 21-22, 1969. There were 309 registrants including 211 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for South-eastern Sectional Meetings, there were three invited speakers. Professor Marvin Rosenblum of the University of Virginia was introduced by Professor Richard D. Anderson. He spoke of Shifts and Hilbert space factorization problems. Professor Nickolas Heerema of Florida State University, who was introduced by Professor Paul Hill, spoke on Higher derivations and automorphisms of complete local rings. Professor S. M. Shah of the University of Kentucky was introduced by Professor Pasquale Porcelli. The title of his address was Univalent functions with univalent derivatives.

The sessions for contributed papers were chaired by Professors John Luedeman, Charles McArthur, Ralph Bennett, Charles E. Clark, William Heinzer, Charles Kellogg, John Bryant, Louis McAuley, and Robert Gilmer.
