

THE MARCH MEETING IN GAINESVILLE

The seven hundred twelfth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at The University of Florida in Gainesville, Florida, on Thursday and Friday, March 7–8, 1974. There were 146 registrations, of which 129 were members.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for the South-eastern Sectional Meetings, hour addresses were given by A. T. Bharucha-Reid of the Georgia Institute of Technology, and J. R. Shoenfield of Duke University. Professor John Neff introduced Professor Bharucha-Reid who spoke on “Probabilistic operator theory.” Professor John Roberts introduced Professor Shoenfield who talked about “The decision problem for recursively enumerable degrees.”

There were two special sessions on Thursday at 2:30 P.M. The first session on Dynamical Systems, Flows, and One-Parameter Semigroups of Transformations was chaired by Professor John Neuberger of Emory University. The other special session on Thursday on Ordered Groups was chaired by Professor Jorge Martinez of the University of Florida. In addition to the special sessions three sessions for contributed papers were chaired by Professors A. W. Goodman, O. G. Harrold, and K. Yanosko.

At 10:15 A.M. on Friday the second part of the special session on Dynamical Systems, Flows, and One-Parameter Semigroups of Transformations chaired by John Neuberger was held. There were also three sessions for contributed papers held on Friday at 10:15 A.M. chaired by Professors A. M. Dutton, A. Kartsatos, and A. Sobczyk.

This meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held in conjunction with the meeting of the Florida Section of the Mathematical Association of America which began after the adjournment of the AMS meeting.

There was a dutch treat cocktail party on Friday evening at 5:30 P.M. Professor Charles Nelson was in charge of local arrangements.
