## Walter Thirring

This issue of Communications in Mathematical Physics is dedicated to Walter Thirring on the occasion of his sixtieth birthday on April 29, 1987. By this means the editors wish to honor a man who has not only made important contributions in many diverse areas of mathematical and theoretical physics, but has also played a leading role in fostering fruitful interchanges between mathematics and physics.
