

THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN RIVERSIDE

The six hundred sixty-first meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, November 16, 1968 at the University of California, Riverside, in Riverside, California. There were 118 registrants at this meeting, 106 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, there were two invited hour addresses presented at the meeting. Professor Robert Osserman of Stanford University spoke on *Minimal varieties*. He was introduced by Professor Stefan Bergman. Professor Joseph Wolf of the University of California, Berkeley, presented the second hour address on *Geometry and analysis on complex flag manifolds*. He was introduced by Professor Victor Shapiro.

There were five sessions for contributed papers, with Professors L. O. Ferguson, R. B. Herrera, J. F. Hurley, F. T. Metcalf, and R. S. Pierce presiding.
