

THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN LOS ANGELES

The five hundred ninety-fifth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, November 17, 1962 at the University of California, Los Angeles. There were 163 registrants at this meeting, 136 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, hour addresses were given by Professor Dana Scott of the University of California at Berkeley, and by Professor Victor Shapiro of the University of Oregon. Professor Scott's address was entitled *The set of all sets*. He was introduced by Professor Abraham Robinson. Professor Shapiro spoke on *Harmonic analysis and the theory of cochains*. Professor A. E. Taylor introduced Professor Shapiro.

There were three sessions for contributing papers with Professors J. B. Giever, Basil Gordon, and L. H. Lange presiding.
