The five hundred ninety-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held in Chicago, Illinois on April 19 and 20, 1963. All sessions were in Eckhart Hall of the University of Chicago. Sessions for the presentation of contributed papers were held at 3:15 P.M. on Friday and Saturday and 10:00 A.M. on Saturday. Presiding officers were Professors R. H. Bruck, Eldon Dyer, Israel N. Herstein, P. R. Masani, John Roberts, and Herman Rubin.

Members of the Society were guests at a tea held by the Department of Mathematics in the Quadrangle Club on Friday afternoon.
